Letter from Former International Coordinator, Julie SAITO

Dear ASPnet National Coordinators,

Dear Students and Teachers,

Dear Parents,

This is my last newsletter to contribute my message as my 17-year career at UNESCO comes to an end upon my retirement. I took the post as International Coordinator of Associated School of Network(ASPnet) in February 2020, six weeks before the Confinement due to COVID-19started in France and in many countries around the world. Under the unprecedented circumstances, we as a coordination unit of the network of12,000 schools in 182 countries asked ourselves a question "What is our mission" and "What can we do." The answer we found was to facilitate the network members to "stay connected." So, the first newsletter CONNECT was released in March 2020, first as on weekly basis and now as quarterly. Also through many webinars and meetings online, we were able to directly reach out to the ASPnet students and teachers and have their voices heard and liaised with our colleagues across the house of UNESCO.

These experiences under the pandemic reminded me of the first letter exchanges between the two high schools in Japan and Belgium immediately after the establishment of the network in 1953. A Japanese teacher simply sent a letter to a school in Belgium, asking to collaborate on a project together, and that's how their relationship started. It was a beautiful example of how such initiative contributed to the objective of ASPnet: to promote intercultural dialogue and understanding, as a basis of peace building and conciliation.

As we have grown into UNESCO's largest network, the International Coordination unit mobilizes its members through National Coordinators and I feel we need to do more to hear the voices of students and teachers on the ground. In this regard, I was lucky to see the presentations from 14 countries participating in the 5th World Cultural Heritage Youth Symposium in Greece. On the theme of living heritage this year, students demonstrated their effort to answer the question: how to make the tradition revive today. On another occasion during the Cannes Film Festival in May, I also met 4 students from Portugal, a laureate of Mention prize of the Week of Sound Competition. Though studying in different classes, specialized in Arts, Science, History and Literature, they brought their expertise to create an animation video which beautifully reflected the key theme "Peace and Sustainability."

In short, no matter how technology advances to make our life easy to achieve many things, we need to listen to each other and collaborate in person, to make changes for the world more just, peaceful and sustainable. It was my honour and pleasure to have facilitated the ASPnet members to share this core value of the network.

My colleague Lydia Ruprecht will be succeeding me in this role. I wish her every success.

With much appreciation to your great collaboration, I wish all of you to stay happy and stay connected!

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UNESCO ASPnet STUDENTS AWARDED @CANNES FILM FESTIVAL



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

Held on 16 May at the Alexandre III Theatre in Cannes, the event was a resounding success, celebrating the creativity and achievements the **ASPnet** of laureates. thanks to а unique partnership with the City of Cannes.

Gvidas Nagys (Grand Prix) from Lithuania and Samuel Saar (Jury Prize) from Estonia, as well as the 4 students from Portugal who won one of the Special Mentions, and their teachers, were present at Cannes and were marvelous! The members of the Jury were able to handover the prizes to the laureates, while Rone, the composer, gave a glowing commentary on their short films. The video messages by the laureates from Republic of Korea and Lebanon were also shown during the ceremony to a packed audience.

Launch event of the Arts for Transformative Education

A new UNESCO publication "Arts for Transformative Education: A guide for teachers from the UNESCO Associated Schools Network (ASPnet)" was officially launched during the 5th World Cultural Heritage Youth Symposium 2024, 17-21 April 2024, which was organized by the Hellenic Cultural and Educational Club for UNESCO.

The event was hosted at the Toronto Botanical Gardens and the Royal Ontario Museum in partnership with York University. While all the educators attended a hands-on professional development session, students rotated through engaging workshops focused many facets on of sustainable development.

2024 Polish ASPnet Annual Conference

The annual conference of the Polish ASPnet took place on June 10-11, 2024, in Warsaw, Poland. The conference provided а unique opportunity to exchange methods of working within ASPnet at both international and national levels. 
